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



#### GOAL OF NEPI

- To produce sufficient numbers of nurses and midwives who are able to respond to the long-term health needs of communities in Sub-Saharan Africa where they provide up to 90% of services
  - WHO recommends 230 health workers per 100 000 citizens





## HISTORICAL BACKGROUND


- Part of commitment by PEPFAR to train 140 000 health workers
- 2010 HRSA launched NEPI as part of HRSA Global Nursing Capacity Building Program
- ICAP at Columbia University serves as Coordinating Center and Implementing Partner
- NEPI started implementing activities in 2010 in the following countries:
  - Lesotho
  - Malawi
  - Zambia
- 2011 implemented activities in Ethiopia and DRC
- 2013 Implemented activities in South Africa



## NEPI INTERVENTIONS

- NEPI has supported interventions in each country with the objective to increase the *quantity*, *quality* and *relevance* of nurses and midwives
- NEPI supported 22 schools of nursing across six countries;






### WHY WAS NEPI SUCCESFUL

- Strong local ownership of the program by governments through NEPI Technical Working Groups
- Leadership and priority setting by MOH
- Enhanced partnerships within and between countries: Ministries of Health and training institutions
- Innovative educational transformation through ICAP support




#### **CHALLENGES**

- Given substantial role of nurses in health care delivery, Interventions limited to 6 countries and 22 schools
  - scale up urgently needed to ensure quality and quantity nurses who are fit for purpose and practice
- Limited collaboration with other professions
- Continuity of the program may be challenged despite strong sustainability plans, resources are limited
- While NEPI schools have successfully completed USG sub awards, nursing leaders lack skills need to be strengthened to adequately mobilize scarce resources
- Need to build a regional body of nurse leaders to champion the profession and ensure that it is represented at decisionmaking forums/bodies
  - Nursing leadership forum and webinar series in 2017



# FROM NEPI TO AFREHEALTH

- MEPI PI Council invited NEPI schools to share experiences
- The two institutions formed a new organization – AFREhealth to move the agenda beyond the MEPI and NEPI programs
- AFREhealth includes the voice of nursing and currently one of the two deputy chairs is from the nursing profession
